


BYLAW NO. 52-98


A BYLAW PROHIBITING THE PLANTING OF TREES, SHRUBS, OR
PLACEMENT OF STONE PILES OR OTHER OBJECTS ADJACENT TO
CERTAIN ROADS.

The council of the Rural Municipality of Gull Lake No. 139 in the Province of
Saskatchewan enacts as follows under authority of section 206(2)(n), of the R.M. Act.
1989:

1. For the purposes of this bylaw the expression:
 - a) "municipality" means the Rural Municipality of Gull Lake No. 139 of Saskatchewan;
 - b) "road" means any road allowance within the municipality other than:
 - (i) a private road, or
 - (ii) a provincial highway,
 - (iii) a road or highway within a hamlet
2. The planting of trees or shrubs, or the placing of stone piles, portable structures, machinery or other objects on private property within 60 metres (200 feet) from the centre line of any road, and 90 metres (300 feet) from the centre line of any intersection of any municipal roads is hereby prohibited.
3. Where a tree or shrub has been planted, or stone, earth or gravel pile, portable structure, machinery or other objects placed on private property contrary to the provisions of this bylaw, the Council may by order direct the owner of the property to remove the tree, shrub, stone, earth or gravel pile, portable structure, machinery or other object.
4. Any person who contravenes the provisions in this bylaw shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to the penalties in the General Penalty Bylaw of the municipality.


