


BYLAW NO. 53-98


A BYLAW PROHIBITING THE PLANTING OF TREES, SHRUBS, OR PLACEMENT OF STONE PILES OR OTHER OBJECTS ADJACENT TO CERTAIN ROADS WITHIN A SUBDIVISION DEVELOPMENT.

The council of the Rural Municipality of Gull Lake No. 139 in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows under authority of section 206(2)(n), of the R.M. Act. 1989:

1. For the purposes of this bylaw the expression:
  - a) "municipality" means the Rural Municipality of Gull Lake No. 139 of Saskatchewan;
  - b) "road" means any road allowance within a residential subdivision development area within the municipality and immediately adjacent to the town of Gull Lake or the Village of Tompkins other than:
    - (i) a private road, or
    - (ii) a provincial highway
2. The planting of trees or shrubs, or the placing of stone piles, portable structures, machinery or other objects on private property within 2 metres (6 feet) of the owners property line, or expressed as 12 metres (40 feet) from the centre line of any road, and 18 metres ( 60 feet) from the centre line of any intersection of any municipal road is hereby prohibited.
3. Where a tree or shrub has been planted, or stone, earth or gravel pile, portable structure, machinery or other objects placed on private property contrary to the provisions of this bylaw, the Council may by order direct the owner of the property to remove the tree, shrub, stone, earth or gravel pile, portable structure, machinery or other object.
4. Any person who contravenes the provisions in this bylaw shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to the penalties in the General Penalty Bylaw of the municipality.
