

BYLAW NO. 86-05

A BYLAW OF THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF GULL LAKE NO. 139 TO AMEND BYLAW 2/82 KNOWN AS THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF GULL LAKE NO. 139 ZONING BYLAW

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Gull Lake No. 139, in the Province of Saskatchewan in open meeting hereby enacts as follows:

Part 5 Zoning District and Zoning Maps Section E is amended by adding the following:


An Agricultural operator whose agricultural holding within the rural municipality fails to meet the minimum site area requirement of 64 hectares (158 acres) because of the registration of a road-right of way, railway plan, pipeline development or natural features such as streams, bodies of water, or result of a subdivision may be allowed at discretion of councils. The reduced site area allowed below 64 hectares (158 acres) may be whatever size that has been created as a result of a registered plan or natural feature.

This bylaw comes into force on the date of final approval by the Minister of Government Relations.
