THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF GULL LAKE NO. 139 BYLAW NO. 120-12

A BYLAW CONCERNING THE ERECTION OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC SIGNS

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Gull Lake No. 139 in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

- 1. In this Bylaw the expression "road" means any public highway within the municipality as defined in the Highways and Transportation Act, 1983-84, other than a Provincial Highway as designated pursuant to such act.
- "Stop" signs shall be erected at the intersection of roadways at the following location:

NW 32-12-19 W3M on the East side of the road facing South coming from the South.

3. "Yield" signs shall be erected at the intersection of the roadway at the following location:

NE 31-12-19 W3M on the South side of the road facing West coming from the West.

- 4. The signs erected pursuant to Section 2 and 3 hereof shall be erected not less than two metres and not more than fifteen metres from the near edge of the intersected roadway.
- 5. The provisions of the Highway Traffic Act shall apply, wherever applicable, to every sign erected pursuant to Section 2 and 3.
- 6. No person shall alter, remove, deface, knock down or tamper with any sign erected pursuant to this Bylaw.
- 7. Any person who violates any provision of this Bylaw shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to the penalties in the General Penalty Bylaw of the municipality.
