## A BYLAW CONCERNING THE ERECTION OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC SIGNS

The Council for the Rural Municipality of Gull Lake No. 139 in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

- 1. In the Bylaw the expression "road" means any public highway within the municipality as defined in the Highways and Transportation Act, 1997, other than a Provincial Highway as designed pursuant to such act.
- 2. "Stop" signs shall be erected at the intersection of roadways at the following location:

South Side of SW 15-13-19 W3M where Range Road 3193 and Township Road 132 meet. Facing South from the East Side of Road and Facing North From the West Side of Road.

- 3. The signs shall be erected not less than two metres and not more than fifteen metres from the near edge of the intersected roadway.
- 4. No person shall alter, remove, deface, knock down or tamper with any sign erected pursuant to this Bylaw
- 5. The Provisions of the Highway Traffic Act shall apply, wherever applicable, to every sign erected.
- 6. Any person who violates any provision of this Bylaw shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to the penalties I the General Penalty Bylaw of the municipality.
